company, created by General Law or special Act, in general meeting assembled, from time to time, to provide for calling in and cancelling the whole or any part of the capital stock and issuing other stock instead thereof at such par value as they may decide on, to an amount not exceeding the true value of such stock, in such manner as to provide such contingent fund or surplus not represented by stock as they may decide to be necessary; provided, that notice of every such meeting of stockholders shall be given in the manner required by Section 76 of Article 23 of the Code of Public General Laws, and the proceedings thereafter shall be similar to those prescribed in Sections 77 and 78 of said Article.

CHAPTER 252.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Sections 104, 105, 105A and 105B of Article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Dorchester County," sub-title "County Commissioners," and to add one additional section to follow said Section 105, to be numbered 105C, relating to the number, term, election and compensation of the County Commissioners of said county, and increasing the number of County Commissioners to five.

SECTION I. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 104, 105, 105A and 105B of Article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Dorchester County," subtitle "County Commissioners," be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments, and that one additional section, to follow Section 105 and to be numbered 105C, be and the same is hereby added to said Article 10, to read as follows:

Election of County Commissioners.

104. At the general election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in the month of November, 1905, there shall be elected three County Commissioners for Dorchester County, two for the term of six years and one for the term of four years; and political parties in making the nominations for the office of County Commissioners in said county shall designate the term for which they are nominated; said three County Commissioners elected at said election, together with the two
