

resignation or incapacity the office has become vacant be not then completed, a Commissioner shall be elected to serve for the unexpired term occasioned by the vacancy.

105B. The powers and duties of County Commissioners shall be such as are now and may hereafter be prescribed by law.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 253.

AN ACT to repeal Chapter 410 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the Session of 1902, regulating the closed season for hunting in Anne Arundel and Prince George's Counties, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Act of 1902, Chapter 410, of the General Assembly of Maryland be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That no person shall shoot or in any manner hunt, catch, kill or have in possession in Prince George's County, in this State, any partridge or quail, English or Mongolian pheasant, American pheasant or rabbit between the twenty-fifth day of December and the ninth day of November following, both days exclusive, in each and every year; or any woodcock between the first day of January and the first day of July following, both days exclusive, in each and every year; or any snipe or plover between the first day of May and the tenth day of September following, both days inclusive, in each and every year, under a fine of not less than one dollar nor more than ten dollars for each of the aforesaid birds or game animals so shot, caught, killed or in possession.

Magistrates

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That any justice of the peace of this State in and for the county where the offense shall be committed shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine all prosecutions for the purpose of enforcing fines and costs collectible under the provisions of this Act, and all such fines and costs are hereby expressly made subject to the provisions of Section 8 of Chapter 293 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the Session of 1896, and in all cases where such prosecutions are begun or instituted by any person other
