than the State game warden or one of the deputy game wardens of this State, and shall result in the collection of a fine or fines, then one-half of such fine or fines, after the proper magistrate's costs in the trial court costs or decision of the case shall have been paid, shall be paid to the informer, and the other half to the school fund of the county in which said prosecution is conducted; and in case of failure to pay such fine and costs the offender shall be committed by the Judge or justice of the peace who imposed the fine to the county jail for ten days.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That nothing in this Act shall Game for breeding purapply to any person who may have in his possession partridges, poses exquails or pheasants imported into the State of Maryland for breeding purposes.

Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That all Acts or parts of Acts and all sections or parts of sections of the Code of Public General and Public Local Laws now in force in the State of Maryland inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 6. And be it enacted. That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 254.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Sections 24, 25 and 117 of Article 33 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Elections,"

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 24, 25 and 117 of Article 33 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Elections," be and the same are hereby severally repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as follows:

24. In the counties a new general registration shall be made New general by each Board of Registry in the year 1906. Such new general registration of voters. registration shall be made in the same way, at the same times and under the same rules and provisions in all respects as are in this Article prescribed for the first general registration.

25. In the City of Baltimore there shall be a general registration in the year 1906 and biennially thereafter. Before biennially. the November election, 1904 and 1905, and in the year 1907, and in every alternate year thereafter, the last general regis-
