of said parties, not earlier than the second Saturday in Tune, and not later than the second Saturday in September.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted. That it shall be the duty of the governing bodies of said political parties, as soon as they have Duty of political parties. agreed upon a day, to notify the Supervisors of Elections of the day selected, which notice shall be at least fifteen days before the date fixed for said primary election; and in case said governing bodies shall fail to agree on a day for holding said primary election, they shall be held on the second Saturday in September in the year 1905, and biennially thereafter, and if no notice is received by said Supervisors of Elections, then it shall be the duty of said Board of Supervisors of Elections, at least fifteen days before the second Saturday in September in the year 1905, and biennially thereafter, to select four judges and two clerks, taking two of said judges and one of said clerks from each of the said political parties, to act as the judges and clerks in the primaries to be held in each election precinct of the county; and the said Board of Supervisors of Elections shall give notice by publication of the names of all of said judges and Advertising list clerks and the precinct for which they are selected by causing of judges and and clerks. the same to be published by two insertions in two of the weekly newspapers printed in Harford County, one of said papers, if possible, being of opposite political faith from that of a majority of said Board of Supervisors of Elections.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted. That said Board of Supervisors of Elections, in appointing the judges and clerks, and in the no-Designation of tice thereof, shall designate the persons intended by them to represent the said political parties respectively. Challengers and watchers representing the candidates of said parties shall be allowed to be present at the several voting places during the voting and counting of the ballots.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That the form of the ballots, with the names of the candidates or delegates to be voted for for Form of ballots the several offices to be filled, shall be furnished by the governing bodies of the said political parties to the said Supervisors of Elections at least ten days before the day upon which said primary is held.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That the Supervisors of Elections shall furnish to the judges all the ballots to be used at said Supervisors of Elections to primaries, and the blanks upon which their returns are to be furnish ballots made, and to prevent voters belonging to or acting with one political party from inadvertently or intentionally casting their ballots for candidates for nomination or election as delegates
