

to any nominating convention of any other party; the ballots of said party shall be printed upon paper of different colors, and until after the next general registration every person offering to vote shall be required to state to which party he belongs and the candidates of which party he intends to vote for at the State or county election, and he shall be supplied only with the official ballot prepared for the candidates of such party.

Hours of opening and closing of polls.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the polls shall be open at twelve o'clock M., and close at six o'clock P.M., on the day fixed for said primary; the books of registry shall be furnished to the judges at each polling place, and shall be used at said primaries for the purpose of determining the right of the party applying to vote, and no one shall be entitled to vote at said primary elections who is not a registered voter in the precinct in which he applies to vote; but the said judges of election are not to make any marks or entries on said registration books, but are to use the same for the purpose of determining the right of the applicant to vote.

Appointing a place of voting.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That it shall be the duty of said Board of Supervisors of Elections to appoint the place of voting in each precinct, and to furnish two ballot boxes for each precinct, one to be used by each political party.

Form of oath to be taken.

SEC. 8. *And be it enacted*, That before entering upon the discharge of their duties one of the clerks in each of the precincts in Harford County shall administer to the judges the following oath: "You do make oath in the presence of Almighty God that you will well and faithfully perform the office of in election precinct to the best of your ability, and in all things comply with the provisions of the primary election law." and one of said judges shall in turn administer the same oath to the clerks of election, said oath to be in writing, and to be returned to the Supervisors of Elections on the Tuesday following said primary election by the return judges of said precinct.

Compensation.

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted*, That the compensation of said judges and clerks shall be two dollars, and the return judges shall have an additional three dollars for the day upon which they make their return to the Supervisors of Elections as above stated, and the said Supervisors of Elections shall, in addition to the compensation they now receive, receive the further sum of one hundred dollars each for the year 1905, and biennially thereafter, for the extra duties required of them under the provisions of this Act.
