

value of at least three hundred dollars; and the said Commissioners shall be elected on the first Monday of May in each year by the adult male citizens of the said town who shall have resided therein for six months, and who shall also be citizens of the United States; and the said Town Commissioners shall serve without compensation, either direct or indirect.

Commissioners to be election judges. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the Commissioners of said town shall be judges of all elections, and the proceedings thereof shall be recorded under their direction. Every Commissioner before he proceeds to act as judge of election shall make oath that he will faithfully and impartially permit every person to vote at such election who shall be qualified to vote, and that he will not suffer any person to vote at such election who shall not, in his judgment, be qualified to vote. Every person elected as Commissioner, before he enters upon the duties of his office, shall make oath before some justice of the peace that he will diligently and faithfully, without favor or partiality or prejudice, perform the duties of a Commissioner of said town, and a certificate of such qualification shall be returned by said justice to the Commissioners, who shall record and file the same among their proceedings.

Oath.

President of Board. SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That the Commissioners at their first meeting after being qualified according to law, shall choose some one of their number president thereof, whose duty it shall be to preside at all meetings of the Board, preserve order and give such directions as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioners to carry into effect the provisions of this subtitle of this Article; and to give the casting vote in case of a tie.

Town Hall. SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That they may meet together, from time to time, at such house as may be designated by them as the Town Hall, as often as occasion may require upon the business of said town, but not less than once in every three months; and if, during the year for which they may be elected, any of the Commissioners should die, resign or remove from the said town, refuse to act, or be otherwise disqualified, an election to fill such vacancy shall be held, at which all persons as specified in Section 1 shall be entitled to vote.

Boundaries of corporation. SEC. 6. *And be it enacted,* That the metes and bounds of the town of Vienna shall be as follows: Beginning at the Nanticoke river on the line with the B., C. & A. Railroad bridge where it crosses the Nanticoke river; thence with said railroad until it intersects the county road leading from Vienna to Indiantown; thence on a line parallel to Front street one-fourth of a mile or until it intersects the county road leading
