

of the General Assembly of Maryland to the sale, grant and conveyance by the Trustees of the Third Haven Monthly Meeting of Friends of Talbot County of certain property belonging to said meeting, located near the town of Denton, in Caroline County."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 1 of Chapter 97 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1902, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

1. That the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland be and the same are hereby declared, given and granted to the Trustees of the Third Haven Monthly Meeting of Friends of Talbot County to sell, grant and convey in fee simple to J. Edward Tylor, the property of the said Third Haven Monthly Meeting of Friends, located in Caroline County, State of Maryland, and known as the Neck Meeting-house and yard, located on the north side of the road leading from Denton to Hillsboro, and one-half mile from Denton bridge, containing one and one-half acres of land, more or less.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 322.

AN ACT to authorize and empower the Mayor, Counsellor and Aldermen of the City of Annapolis to purchase stock of the Annapolis Water Company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Mayor, Counsellor and Aldermen of the City of Annapolis are hereby authorized and empowered to purchase stock of the Annapolis Water Company, in their discretion, whenever the same is for sale, and may borrow for the purchase thereof, and may use said stock as an offset to the debt incurred therefor, and as collateral for the purchase money; provided, that after having purchased stock in the corporate name of the City of Annapolis for the benefit and use of said city, it shall not be alienated or hypothecated for any other debt whatsoever.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
