costs incident to the proceeding, in the same manner as if judgment had been rendered in said court for the same; and in case of insurance on buildings, it shall be lawful for the owner or for the company to apply by petition in writing to the Circuit Court for the county wherein such property is situated to designate the boundaries of the land affected by the lien provided in this Act; and it shall be the duty of the court to issue an order to the County Surveyor or some other surveyor to examine the building insured and to make a report to the court, in which he shall sufficiently designate by metes and bounds and courses and distances, and by a plat, if necessary, the limit and extent of the land under and surrounding the said insured building, necessary for the ordinary and useful purposes thereof, and such report, if approved by the court, shall be entered at length upon the records of said court and shall be conclusive upon all persons concerned.

Entered upon court records.

16. The charter of the company shall be and the same is hereby perpetual; provided that the General Assembly of Maryland reserves to itself the right to amend or repeal the same at any time.

Members to vote on Act.

Charter.

17. This Act shall be submitted to the members of said company at a special meeting thereof to be called by the president of said company and to be held on or before the second Monday in December, 1904, and if a majority of the members present at such meeting shall give their consent, then this Act shall take effect from and after the date of said meeting; but if at such meeting a majority of the members then present do not assent, then this Act shall not take effect but shall be null and void.

CHAPTER 334.

AN ACT to add two sections to Article 22 of the Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland, title "Washington County," sub-title "Williamsport," to be known as Sections 411A and 411B, to follow Section 411 of said Article as repealed and re-enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland of 1904, Chapter 17, and approved February 25, 1904; and to give additional powers to the Burgess and Commissioners of Williamsport relating to the streets and public places and the lighting of said town.
