

shall administer to all persons who shall personally appear to register the following oath or affirmation: "You do solemnly swear (or affirm) that you will fully and truly answer all such questions as shall be put to you touching your place of residence, name, birth, your qualification as a voter and your right as such to register and vote in Frederick City under the laws of the State of Maryland." 2. The two officers of registration shall make the entries required by this Article in the two registry books. 3. The name and age of every applicant shall be entered in such registry books and all the facts of his application shall be therein stated as herein provided, whether he be entitled to vote or not. If it shall be determined by the Board that he is not a qualified voter in said precinct, then an entry shall be made in the appropriate column "No" and a line shall be drawn in red ink through his name and through all other entries on the line on which his name is written, but so that the name and entries shall remain legible; and if qualified an entry shall be made in said column "Yes," and under the head "Remarks" shall be stated that description under which he is so held to be a qualified voter, as provided in the next subsection by the use of the words, "First," "Second" or "Third," as the case may be. 4. Any person who has never been convicted of any infamous crime either in this State or elsewhere, possessing the qualifications prescribed by Section 156 of this Article, shall be entitled to be registered and to vote at all municipal elections hereafter held in said City of Frederick, provided he shall also possess at least one of the following qualifications, namely: First, If he is the bona fide actual owner of real or personal property of the value of five hundred dollars or upwards, for which he has been duly and lawfully assessed on the assessment books of said city; or, secondly, If prior to January 1, 1869, he was entitled to vote in the State of Maryland or elsewhere in the United States at a State election; or, thirdly, If he is the male lineal descendant of any person who prior to January 1, 1869, was entitled to vote in the State of Maryland or elsewhere in the United States at a State election. 5. The headings to the registry books shall be so prepared that the registry shall be made alphabetically according to the surname of each person applying, and so that the residence and postoffice address of such persons shall appear in the first columns; the registers shall be ruled and one name shall be written on each line, but no name or names shall be written between lines; the entries shall be made as follows: (a) Under the column "Residence and postoffice address," the name and number of
