

for collecting certain information in the public interest, and that he should have printed for distribution for the information of the people his annual report to the Governor of Maryland, covering the period to the first day of May in each year; and that the State shall provide an anemometer for the Mine Inspector's use; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrants upon the Treasurer in the sum of one hundred and forty-two dollars, in favor of Charles T. Clayton, to pay for the printing of blanks for the use of the Mine Inspector from July 1, 1902, to January 1, 1904, and for printing the annual report of the Mine Inspector to May 1, 1903, as required by Chapter 124 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1902, at the January Session; and in the sum of eighteen dollars and eighty-five cents, in favor of James P. Carroll, to pay for an anemometer for the use of the Mine Inspector, as required by Chapter 124 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1902 as aforesaid.

CHAPTER 40.

AN ACT to authorize the County Commissioners of Queen Anne's County to grant a pension to Abraham Smith of said county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the County Commissioners of Queen Anne's County be and the same are hereby authorized and empowered to grant and pay to Abraham Smith of said county an annual pension of fifty dollars for and during the natural life of the said Abraham Smith, and to provide for and levy the said sum on the assessable property of said county.
