lic General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Fraud," to be numbered Section 97C, to follow Section 97, and to read as follows:

Unlawful to wear insignia, etc., of B. P. O. E.

97C. Any person who shall unlawfully wear the insignia, distinctive ribbons or membership rosette or button of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America or use the same to obtain aid or assistance within the State, unless he shall be entitled to use or wear the same under the constitution and by-laws, rules and regulations of said organization, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 348.

AN ACT to authorize the County Commissioners of Harford County to grant a pension to Charles L. Pyle, of said county.

Empowered to grant an annual pension.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the County Commissioners of Harford County are hereby authorized and empowered to grant an annual pension of one hundred dollars to Charles L. Pyle, of said county, during the natural life of the said Charles L. Pyle, and to levy said sum on the assessable property of said county.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 349.

AN ACT to establish a sewerage system for the City of Baltimore; to empower the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to issue stock to an amount not exceeding ten million dollars for the purpose of defraying the cost of said sewerage system; to authorize the submission of an ordinance to that end to the legal voters of the City of Baltimore, and to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to establish a system of sewer rates.
