

CHAPTER 358.

AN ACT for the better protection of game birds, song birds, insectivorous birds in St. Mary's County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 15H, of Chapter 206, of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1898, be and the same is hereby made applicable to St. Mary's County, anything in said Act to the contrary notwithstanding, and that Section 1, of Chapter 588, of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1892, be repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

For better protection of birds.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person in St. Mary's County to shoot, kill or catch, or in any manner to entrap or ensnare any partridge or quail in said county between the twenty-fourth day of December and the first day of November; nor any woodcock between the twenty-fourth day of February and the fourth day of July; nor any rabbit between the fifteenth day of January and the first day of November of each year.

Closed seasons.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That any of the Public Local Laws of St. Mary's County be and the same are hereby repealed in so far as they may be inconsistent with Section 15H of Chapter 206 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1898.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 359.

AN ACT to authorize the Board of School Commissioners of Anne Arundel County to borrow money on faith of their income as the said income accrues, for the purpose of enabling them to keep the public schools of Anne Arundel County open for the free scholastic year of 1904.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Board of County School Commissioners be and they are hereby authorized to borrow on the faith of their income, from the State and county taxation and other sources of revenue, a sum of money to enable them to pay the teachers' salaries and to keep the public schools open in 1904; and the same shall be borrowed upon a note signed by the president of the Board of School Commissioners and attested by its

Authorizing School Commissioners to borrow funds.
