## CHAPTER 368.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 132A of Article 81 of the Code of Public General Laws, title, "Revenue and Taxes," sub-title "State Tax Commission," as amended by the Acts of 1902, Chapter 236.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 132A, of Article 81, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Revenue and Taxes," sub-title "State Tax Commission," as amended by the Acts State Tax Commission. of 1902, Chapter 236, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

132A. The State Tax Commission may employ one clerk whose compensation shall be \$1,800 per annum, one assistant Clerk and asclerk whose compensation shall be \$1,500 per annum, and one whose compensation shall be \$1,200 per annum.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 369.

AN ACT authorizing the Board of Public Works to build or buy a suitable boat to guard the waters of the Little Choptank river, Dorchester County.

WHEREAS, The schooner, Julia Hamilton, of the State Fishery Force, now guarding the waters of the Little Choptank Unseaworthy river, having become totally unseaworthy for police duty, it for police duty. is therefore meet that her place should be supplied by a proper vessel: therefore,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Board of Public Works be and they are hereby authorized to build or buy a suitable vessel to guard the waters Authority to of the Little Choptank river, the cost thereof not to exceed a suitable the sum of \$2,800, to be paid from the oyster fund; and the Comptroller of the Treasury is hereby authorized to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer for such sum or sums as the said Board of Public Works, upon their requisition, may require for the purpose herein mentioned, not exceeding, however, the sum above-mentioned.
