forfeiture in all recognizance at any and all times of said court in each particular case as follows: "Amount of bond collected," or what deposition he has made of said forfeited recognizance, and each of said returns shall be signed by the sheriff of said county, and the Clerk of the said court shall note upon the criminal docket in each particular case thereon the returns thus made to him by the said sheriff of said county, and upon the failure of the sheriff to so make said returns as required by this Act, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall pay a fine to the county for each such offense not more than the sum of five hundred dollars, to be imposed by the Circuit Court for Washington County and collected as other fines are.

Penalty for failure to make such returns.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 372.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Chapter 543, Acts of 1902, title "Alleghany County," sub-title "Fish and Fishing," and to add an additional section thereto.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That it shall be unlawful to take, catch or kill, have in possession, offer for sale or transport within Alleghany County, any black bass of any kind of a size less than eight inches, measuring from the tip of the nose to the end of the tail or caudal fin; and any pickerel or perch, otherwise known as wall-eyed pike and California salmon of a size less than fourteen inches, measuring from the tip of the nose to the end of the tail or caudal fin; take, catch or kill the same in any manner between the first day of April and the fifteenth day of June in each and every year, under a penalty of five dollars for each of said fish so taken, caught or killed or had in possession for transport.

Pertaining to catching fish in Alleghany County.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That it shall be unlawful to construct in the waters of said county any fish pot, fish weir or other like contrivance for taking of fish, under the penalty of twenty-five dollars for each offense, and it shall be the duty of the game warden or a deputy game warden to compel the owner or user of such fish pot or fish weir or other like

Fish pots, weirs, etc., unlawful.
