CHAPTER 376.

AN ACT to add a new section to Article 23, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Corporations," sub-title "Insurance Department," to be known as Section 123A, and to follow Section 123.

insurance. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That a new section be added to Article 23 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Corporations," sub-title "Insurance Department," to be known as Section 135A, to follow Section 135, and to read as follows:

Statement of Insurance Commissioner. 135A. The statement or statements required to be made to the Insurance Commissioner under Section 135 of this Article may, for the year ending December 31, 1903, be transmitted on or before July 1, 1904, in lieu of the time or times provided in said Section 135 of this Article, and the Insurance Commissioner shall not be required to publish abstracts of the said statement or statements as required by Section 139 of this Article, nor his annual statement to the Governor, as he is required by Sub-Section 129 of this Article, until September 1, 1904.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 377.

Unlawful to license sale of liquors. AN ACT to prohibit the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer within the limits of Ballenger or Election District No. 23, in Frederick County, Maryland.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall not be lawful for the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Frederick County to issue a license to any person, persons, partnership or corporation to sell or barter spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer at any place within the limits of Ballenger District or Election District No. 23, in Frederick County, Maryland.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
