SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That the said body corporate shall To insure have the right to guarantee or insure title to real or personal property, to insure the same upon such terms as may be agreed upon, and shall have the right to guarantee the security, integrity and income of investments or mortgages upon real or personal property; and the said corporation shall have the right to receive on deposit evidence of debt for collection, chattels, money, stocks, bonds and paper writings, upon such terms as may be agreed upon.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted. That this charter shall be subject to the provisions of the Acts of 1892, Chapters 109-279, except where otherwise provided by this Act.

SEC. 6. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 381.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 8 of Article 83 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Sales and Notices," sub-title "Exemption from Execution."

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Mary-Resenacted. land, That Section 8 of Article 83 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Sales and Notices," sub-title "Exemption from Execution," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments, so as to read as follows:

8. One hundred dollars in property, whether the same con-Exemption sist of money, land or goods, of every defendant, as well as all money payable in the nature of insurance, benefit or relief in the contingency or event of sickness, accident, hurt or death of any person, shall be exempt from execution or seizure in satisfaction of debt or claim upon any judgment in any civil proceedings, except on judgments for breach of promise to marry or for seduction.

SEC. 2. And he it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

AN ACT to incorporate "The Washington County Hospital Association."

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Mary-TheWashingland, That S. Martin Bloom, William Updegraff, Edward W. Mealey, George B. Oswald, William P. Lane, James P. Harter, William Newcomer, M. Emmet Cullen and B. Abner Betts, of Washington County, and their successors, as hereinafter provided for, be and they are hereby created a body corporate with perpetual succession under the name of "The Washington"
