WHEREAS, The Maryland Casualty Company was, by Sections 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of Chapter 386 of the Acts of 1902, granted the right and empowered and authorized to carry on and conduct certain branches of business in said sections mentioned and described; and,

WHEREAS, Although so authorized and empowered, the said Maryland Casualty Company has not exercised any of the rights, powers, privileges and franchises granted to or conferred upon it, "the said Maryland Casualty Company," by said Sections 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of said Chapter 386 of the Acts of 1902, and has not carried on or conducted, or attempted to carry on or conduct any of the branches of business in said sections mentioned and described; therefore,

Empowering of its rights.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 of Chapter 386 of the Acts of 1902, entitled "An Act to amend the Charter and extend the powers of the Maryland Casualty Company," be and the same are hereby repealed, and that the said Sections 7 and 8 be and the same are hereby re-enacted, with amendments, so as to read as follows:

Amendment.

7. The said corporation is authorized to take, have, hold and enjoy all such estates, real, personal and mixed, as may be obtained by the investment of its capital stock, and all other moneys or funds that may come into its possession in course of its dealings and business (and the same to sell, grant, mortgage, lease and dispose of at its pleasure), and execute, acknowledge and deliver all deeds and other instruments of writing concerning the same.

To acknowledge and deliver deeds, etc.

8. The said company shall have the further power to insure any person or persons, firm or corporation, against any and all loss, damage or liability arising from or occasioned by theft, larceny, robbery or burglary; provided, however, that nothing in this Act shall in any way affect any liability incurred by said corporation or any acts done by it, if any, under or by virtue of the sections hereby repealed.

Power to insure against theft, etc.

SEC 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
