CHAPTER 401.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Sections 59 to 79 inclusive, of Article 19 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "St. Mary's County," sub-title "Leonardtown," and the amendments additional thereto, as amended and enacted by Chapter 479 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1900, entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments Sections 73 and 74 of Article 19 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'St. Mary's County,' sub-title 'Leonardtown,' and to change the name of the corporation mentioned therein."

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Mary-Leonardtown land, That Sections 59 to 79 inclusive, of Article 19 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "St. Mary's County," sub-title "Leonardtown," and the amendmnets and additions thereto, as amended and enacted by Chapter 479 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1900, be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments.

59. The citizens of the village of Leonardtown in St. Mary's Commission-County are and shall continue to be a body corporate by the name of "The Commissioners of Leonardtown," and the same shall have perpetual succession, may sue and be sued, use a common seal and possess such powers, privileges and incidents, as may attend to a municipal corporation, may purchase and hold real, personal and mixed property, and dispose of the same for the benefit of the said town.

60. The taxable and corporate limits of said town shall be Establishing accurately established and bounded, and a full description of same be filed with the Clerk of the Circuit Court for St. Mary's County, to be recorded in one of the deed records of said county.

61. The male citizens living within the corporate limits of Qualification "The Commissioners of Leonardtown," above twenty-one years of age, who shall have resided in the town for the space of four months, and twelve months in the State of Maryland next preceding the election, and shall be at the time a citizen of the United States, together with residents of St. Mary's County owning real estate within said corporation, and posessing all the above-prescribed qualifications, except residing in said town, shall elect by ballot on the first Monday in May, 1904, at the Court House or at such other suitable place as may be designated by the Commissioners of the village of Leonardtown, five discreet persons who shall have all the requisites of a voter in said town, and who shall have resided within the limits of said corporation for at least twelve months next preceding the election. Three of the Commissioners elected shall serve for the term of two years, and two for the term of one year, and the time each Commissioner is to serve shall be determined by lot among themselves, and annually thereafter, on the first Monday in May in each year, alternately, two and
