

their treasurer, to be accompanied by an estimate of the expenses to which the money so drawn is to be applied.

SEC 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 51.

AN ACT to give power to the Board of Trustees of the Fifth Regiment Armory to rent the Fifth Regiment Armory temporarily and to authorize the City of Baltimore to provide temporary quarters for the Fifth Regiment Infantry, Maryland National Guard.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Board of Trustees of the Fifth Regiment Armory are authorized and empowered to rent such portion or portions of the Fifth Regiment Armory, as they deem proper, to any firm or corporation deprived of its place of business by the fire of Sunday, February 7, 1904, for a period not exceeding one year, on such terms as to the said board seems proper. the rent to be used by the said board in its discretion for the improvement of the Fifth Regiment Armory.

Limiting time of rental of portions of armory for business purposes.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That in the event of such rental being effected by said board, the Fifth Regiment of Infantry, Maryland National Guard, shall vacate the said Armory at such time as may be determined by said board.

To vacate.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore are hereby authorized and empowered to permit the said Fifth Regiment of Infantry, Maryland National Guard, to occupy, without charge, during the period the said regiment is out of possession of said Fifth Regiment Armory, any public building belonging to the City of Baltimore, the use of which, in the judgment of the said Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, can be spared to said Fifth Regiment Infantry, without detriment to the public interest.

To occupy city property without cost to the State.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
