for St. Mary's County for a period not exceeding sixty days, or until such fines are paid; and instead of the foregoing penalties, it shall be lawful, in the case of vagrancy or tramps, as defined by the laws of Maryland, to sentence such vagrant or tramp to hard labor on the public streets within the limits of "The Commissioners of Leonardtown," not exceeding ten days. And all fines and forfeitures imposed by the said Commissioners, by virtue of any law or ordinance, shall be applied in such manner for the use of said village, as may from time to time be directed by ordinance.

Penalty for violation.

Ordinances valid.

74. All ordinances and by-laws heretofore passed by "The Commissioners of the Village of Leonardtown," and now in force and not in conflict with the provisions of this charter, shall be valid and remain in force until the same are repealed, amended or modified by "The Commissioners of Leonardtown;" and all Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, heretofore passed, relating to or in any way affecting "The Commissioners of the Village of Leonardtown," and not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, shall remain in force and effect for "The Commissioners of Leonardtown" in the same manner and to the same extent and purpose as if said Act or Acts were now repealed and re-enacted so as to read in lieu of the words "The Commissioners of the Village of Leonardtown," the words, "The Commissioners of Leonardtown."

Quorum.

75. A majority of "The Commissioners of Leonardtown" shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and in the absence of the president of their Board, the Commissioners present may appoint a member president pro tem., who shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the rules and regulations prescribed for the president.

No compensation.

76. "The Commissioners of Leonardtown" shall receive no compensation for their services.

Restriction.

77. "The Commissioners of Leonardtown" shall issue no device, token, note, certificate or evidence of debt to be used as currency.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the first day of May, 1904.

CHAPTER 402.

AN ACT to refund to George W. Cook a sum of money erroneously paid into the State Treasury.

Refunding over-payment of taxes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer of the State, payable to George W. Cook, for the amount of fifteen dollars and twenty-five cents, said amount having erroneously been paid
