Charles County shall, in each and every year, levy upon the assessable property of said county such sum of money as may be necessary to pay the interest on the said bonds by them issued in pursuance of this Act, as the same shall fall due, and the principal thereof when the same may become due, or such sum as, in their discretion, may be required and set aside as a fund to gradually retire and redeem said bonds, and said taxes authorized by this Act shall be collected as other taxes are collected in said county.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, and that this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 407

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Sections 100 to 103, both inclusive, of Article 19 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "St. Mary's County," sub-title "Roads," as amended by Chapter 354 of the Acts of 1902, and to repeal Sections 103A to 103F, both inclusive, of said Article under said title and sub-title.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Mary-Roads-St. land, That Sections 100 to 103, both inclusive, of Article 19 of County. the Code of Public Local Laws, title "St. Mary's County," subtitle "Roads," as amended by Chapter 351 of the Acts of 1902 be and the same are respectively repealed and re-enacted with amendments; and be it enacted, that Sections 100A to 103F, both inclusive, of said Article, under said title and sub-title, be and the same are hereby expressly repealed.

100. The County Commissioners are hereby authorized and Empowered empowered to purchase in such manner and on such terms as they may deem best for the interest of the county five mules for each of the three Commissioners' districts of the county, to be used in operating the three road machines now belonging to said county, and for other purposes in repairing said roads; they shall make provision for the feeding and proper care of said mules, and at the conclusion of general road work in each and every year, they may, in their discretion, place said mules in the custody of such persons as will properly care for them at the least expense to the county.
