

## CHAPTER 52.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay Isaac Benesch & Sons, Frank A. Monroe and the Evening Capital for furniture, etc., furnished the Senate and House of Delegates of Maryland.

Appropriations

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller of the State be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the Treasurer of the State for four hundred and forty-eight dollars in favor of Isaac Benesch & Sons; for ten dollars and fifty cents in favor of Frank A. Monroe; for five dollars in favor of the Evening Capital.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 53.

AN ACT to pay the claim of the William J. C. Dulany Company for stationery furnished sundry departments of the State from August 30, 1902, to May 31, 1903.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer for the sum of nine hundred and twenty-five dollars and forty-one cents in favor of the said William J. C. Dulany Company for supplies furnished to the State Library, the Executive Department, and the Court of Appeals from August 30, 1902, to May 31, 1903.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 54.

AN ACT to repeal Section 3 of Chapter 419 of the Acts passed at the January Session, 1892, of the General Assembly of Maryland, and to re-enact the same with an amendment; and to add two new sections to the said Act, to be known as Section 3A and Section 3B.
