

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the citizens of the town of Glen Echo are hereby created a body corporate by the name and style of Glen Echo, with all the powers and privileges of a body politic and corporate, and by said corporate name may have perpetual succession, sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in any court of law or equity, and may have and use a common seal.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the boundaries of said town shall embrace the lands of the National Chautauqua subdivision of Glen Echo of Montgomery County, Maryland, as the same are described, designated and laid out in a plot and certificates thereof recorded in liber J. A. 25, folio 253, of the Land Record books of Montgomery County, Maryland, and running thence with Minnehaha creek, and 300 feet east from middle of said creek, and 300 feet west from middle of said creek to River road. Boundary lines shall be, Cabin Johns creek, north side of Conduit road to a line 300 feet west of the middle of Minnehaha creek running thence north to River road, thence 300 feet each to a line 300 feet east from middle of Minnehaha creek, thence south to Conduit road, thence along Conduit road to end of National Chautauqua subdivision, thence south to towpath of Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, thence west to Cabin John's creek.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the citizens of said town shall, on the first Monday in May in the year 1904, and every second year thereafter on the first Monday in May, at such place or places as shall be designated by the judges of election, between the hours of five o'clock P.M. and nine o'clock P.M., elect, by ballot, one person Mayor of said town, who shall serve for a term of two years or until his successor is elected and qualified. The citizens aforesaid shall also elect on the first Monday in May, 1904, four persons to be members of the Council of said town, who, together with the Mayor, shall constitute the Council of said town; two of the said Councilmen shall serve for a term of two years or until their successors are elected and qualified, and two for a term of one year or until their successors are elected and qualified. The first election shall be held by Wm. H. Roach, Jacob J. Decker and F. Lombard Woodward, who are hereby appointed judges for that purpose, and if any of them shall be absent on the day appointed for said election, the vacancy or vacancies shall be filled by the judge or judges present. The citizens aforesaid shall elect on the first Monday of May, 1904, and annually thereafter, two persons to be members of said Council of said
