to deliver to him all proceedings had for the enforcement of the payment of said taxes, and the said successor, upon the delivery to him of the bills aforesaid, is empowered and required to collect and enforce the payment of said taxes, as hereinbefore provided; and in all cases where a treasurer has taken steps for the enforcement of the payment of taxes and his term shall expire, or he shall vacate his office for any reason before said proceedings are completed, his successor is empowered and required to continue and complete said proceedings for the enforcement of the payment of said taxes and to collect the same, and is hereby clothed with all powers and authority in law had by the retired treasurer for that purpose.

Clothed with authority.

20Q. The said treasurer shall receive a compensation for his services under the provisions of this Act and any amendments thereof in addition to his fees for making assessments and sales, a commission of five per cent. on the amount of taxes, dues, fines and licenses collected by him.

Compensation.

Designating a depository.

20R. The Town Commissioners of Aberdeen shall designate a depository for all moneys belonging to said town, and it shall be the duty of said treasurer to deposit each day in said depository his collections from any source whatsoever to the credit of the town of Aberdeen, and to disburse the same upon the written order of said Town Commissioners and not otherwise.

Power to collect all taxes.

20S. The treasurer appointed under the provisions of this Act shall have full power and authority to collect any and all taxes due and in arrears and remaining unpaid for any year or years prior to the year 1904, and the same to be collected by him in the manner provided for the collection of town taxes by the bailiff of said town before the passage of this Act, and such proceedings shall be had thereon as provided before the passage of this Act.

20T. All laws or parts of laws, general or local, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

 CHAPTER 438.

AN ACT to amend Article 7 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Carroll County," sub-title "Fish," by adding a new section thereto, to be known as Section 39A.
