Providing for special election on "six-million loan."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That a special election shall be held in the City of Baltimore for the submission to the legal voters of said city of an ordinance, the same to be so submitted at such time and place as shall be fixed thereby pursuant to the provisions of Section 7 of Article II of the Constitution of Maryland, authorizing the issuance of stock by the said corporation to an amount not exceeding six million dollars for the purpose of supplying into execution the plan of improvements adopted or to be adopted under the terms of the Act passed at the January Session of the General Assembly of Maryland in the year 1904, and entitled "An Act to create a commission on the burnt district of Baltimore City; to define its duties and powers; to regulate its method of procedure; to define the extent of said district; to provide for opening, extending, widening, straightening and closing streets, lanes and alleys; for establishing public squares and market spaces, building lines and the width of sidewalks in said district; for adding to, extending and partly filling the harbor or basin of Baltimore City; and for establishing public wharves and docks; and to provide for appropriating a portion of the General Sinking Fund of Baltimore City and other moneys for the purposes of this Act.

General Sinking Fund.

Submitting question to the vote of the people.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That said special election shall be held and the result thereof ascertained and determined in accordance with the provisions of the laws relating to elections in the City of Baltimore, so far as the same are applicable to the submission of a question or questions of local concern to the vote of the people of said city. But the Supervisors of Elections of the City of Baltimore shall not be required to supply five booths or compartments for voters in every polling place, nor the whole number of ballots required to be furnished by said election laws, but only such number of booths or compartments in each polling place in the judgment of said Supervisors of Elections will be amply sufficient for the accommodation of voters at said election, and such number of ballots as in the judgment of the said Supervisors of Elections will be amply sufficient for the purposes
