

zenship by investigation and discussion of conditions and details appertaining to representative government; to encourage physical, mental, manual and moral training; to stimulate popular interest in early American history, particularly to encourage research as to the part that those of German blood or birth took in the early development of our nation; to foster and establish trade schools, and to encourage the study of the practical arts, literature and the fine arts; to arrange popular and patriotic festivals, entertainments, etc.; to aid in maintaining public and charitable institutions and work, and to further and advance the love of vocal and instrumental music.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the said corporation hereby formed shall have the power and it is hereby authorized annually, at its pleasure, to observe and celebrate the twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth days of September (or either of them), being the anniversary of the battle of North Point, and the sixth day of October, being in commemoration of the landing of the first body of German colonists in North America, and such other special or patriotic occasions as it may deem proper. And it shall have the privilege of conducting, in connection with these celebrations, a festival of song and music, an exhibition of arts, industries and manufactures, and products of the mines and seas; to fix admission fees and dispose of privileges of every kind and character in connection therewith; to erect booths and stands and conduct the sale of goods and refreshments of all kinds; to provide for attractions, amusements, entertainments and diversions which it may deem proper; to allot space for exhibits and prepare a classification thereof, determine the plan and scope of the festival or exhibition; to appoint judges and examiners and award prizes and premiums, if any.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the said body corporate shall have and enjoy all the general powers, provisions and privileges, and be subject to the general regulations contained in Article 23 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, relating to the formation, powers and regulation of corporations, so far as the same may not be inconsistent with and conflict the special or general regulations or provisions, powers, privileges, rights and advantages conferred or intended to be conferred by this Act.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That the operations of the said body corporate shall be carried on in the State of Maryland, and that its principal office shall be located in Baltimore City.
