

LAWS OF MARYLAND.

Subject to any law or ordinance. that the said company shall be subject to any law or ordinance that may be passed by the municipal authorities of any city or town in Howard County or the County Commissioners of Howard County having jurisdiction for the filling up or restoring streets or roads to their normal condition.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 459.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 116E of Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Prince George's County," sub-title "Treasurer," as amended by Chapter 477 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of the year 1900.

Treasurer of Prince George's County, Md. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 116E of Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Prince George's County," sub-title "Treasurer," as amended by Chapter 477 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of the year 1900, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted as follows:

Compensation of same. 116E. The Treasurer of Prince George's County shall receive in full compensation for the discharge of his official duties as collector of taxes levied for county purposes the sum of three thousand dollars for each year of his term of office, which shall be payable one-fourth on the first day of July, one-fourth on the first day of October, and one-fourth on the first day of January of each fiscal year, and the remaining fourth upon final settlement of said fiscal year by the Treasurer with the County Commissioners of Prince George's County; and shall receive a commission of three and one-half per cent. on all taxes collected by him for the State of Maryland.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 460.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 4 of Article 81 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Revenue and Taxes," sub-title "Exemptions," as repealed and re-enacted by Chapter 120 of the Acts of 1896.
