bonds; each of said bonds shall be payable twenty-five years after date to bearer; redeemable, however, at the pleasure of said Mayor and Council at any time after the expiration of ten years from their respective dates, and said bonds shall have printed on them a distinct reference to the Act and the election directing their issue; and the said bonds shall be consecutively numbered as the same shall be issued, and said bonds shall be non-taxable for municipal or county purposes.

Bonds non-assessable.

Proceeds of sale of bonds.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the proceeds of the sale of said bonds, none of which shall be sold for less than par in cash current money, shall be applied to the improvement of the streets and alleys of said town, and the Mayor and Council shall have power to issue five thousand dollars worth of said bonds as soon as needed and shall issue thereafter in two series two thousand five hundred dollars each worth of said bonds as, in the judgment and discretion of the Mayor and Council of Brunswick, may deem necessary.

Power to levy taxes.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That said Mayor and Council shall have full power and authority and are hereby required to levy all necessary taxes upon the taxable property within the taxable limits of the corporation of Brunswick for the payment of the interest on said bonds to be issued in conformity with this Act, as well as for the payment of the principal thereof at the maturity of said bonds, and shall create a sinking fund for that purpose and levy and collect the necessary taxes therefor, not exceeding the provisions of the charter of the town, and the amount collected annually for the sinking fund shall be invested by the Mayor and Council in some safe, interest-bearing securities and be held intact for the purpose for which it is intended.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

 CHAPTER 467.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking or catching of oysters in the waters of the Patuxent river, between the first day of April and the thirtieth day of September, inclusive.

Pertaining to the catching of oysters.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That it shall be unlawful to take or catch oysters with rakes or tongs in the waters of the Patuxent river, between the first day of April and the thirtieth day of September,
