

of more than five thousand dollars in any one year, but none of said bonds shall be issued to mature before the first day of August, 1907.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That in order to pay the interest on said bonds, the County Commissioners shall annually, beginning with their levy-laying session in 1905, levy on the assessable property of the county a sufficient amount to pay said interest until said bonds shall respectively mature, and for the payment of said bonds they shall, beginning with the year 1907, levy on the assessable property of said county the sum of five thousand dollars to pay said bonds, which shall be paid in the order of their several numbers, beginning with serial Number 1, and in their successive order.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That of the whole issue of said bonds authorized, or so much as may be necessary, the said County Commissioners shall, immediately after signing said bonds as hereinbefore provided, sell at public auction to the highest bidder for cash; which said sale of said bonds shall be made upon due notice by publication in such newspaper or newspapers as the said County Commissioners shall deem proper and necessary.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the proceeds arising from the sale of said bonds shall be applied by the County Commissioners of said county for the purchase of such lots and the erection and furnishing of a new court house and jail building at Oakland, the county seat of said county, and for no other purpose; and for the building and furnishing of said court house and jail, the said Board of County Commissioners shall contract by sealed bids, for which contracts advertisements shall be made in such newspaper or newspapers as the said County Commissioners shall deem proper, giving notice of the time and place of the public opening of such bids, and they shall require such bidder to file with their bids a good and sufficient bond with a surety or sureties to be approved by them in such penalty for the faithful performance of the contract thereunder as they may deem proper; and upon the opening of such bids the said County Commissioners shall award the said contract to the lowest responsible bidders, but they shall have the power to reject any and all bids.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
