Lowest responsible bidders. WHEREAS, The William J. C. Dulany Company was awarded, as public printer, the contract for said work by the Clerk of the Court of Appeals, under Article 78 of the Code of Public General Laws, they being the lowest responsible bidders therefor at and for the sum of twenty-nine thousand nine hundred and ninety dollars, hence, leaving a large deficit; therefore,

To meet the deficiency.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the sum of fifteen thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated to meet the deficiency for the printing of the General Assembly of 1904.

State Treasurer to pay the public printer. SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the Treasurer of the State shall, upon the warrant of the Comptroller, pay to the said William J. C. Dulany Company, public printer, the aforesaid sum of fifteen thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, in accordance with the provisions of Article 78 of the Code of Public General Laws.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 479.

AN ACT to repeal Section 1 of Chapter 332 of the Acts of 1900, entitled "An Act to regulate the compensation of the County Commissioners of Allegany County and to re-enact the same to read as follows:

County Commissioners of Allegany County, Md. Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 1 of Chapter 332 of the Acts of 1900, entitled "An Act to regulate the compensation of the County Commissioners of Allegany County," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Allowance for inspecting roads.

1. That the County Commissioners of Allegany County now in office shall be allowed four dollars per day for inspecting roads, but shall not exceed twenty days in any one year; and those hereafter elected to said office shall meet as often as they shall deem necessary, and they shall receive as full compensation for such services the sum of four hundred dollars per annum for all services rendered in the discharge of the duties of said office.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
