

and to deprive none whom they know or who may be shown to be members of said party of the privilege of voting, and they shall allow no one to vote who has been a member of any other party than the one conducting the election within two years prior to said election, and only those shall vote whose names appear upon the registration books of the respective precincts or districts: and it shall be the duty of the registration officers to act as ballot clerks and give all information to said election board necessary to strictly carry out the provisions of this Act, though all persons whose names do not appear upon said registration books who will be qualified to vote in said district or precinct on the succeeding election day shall be entitled to vote at said primary election. And said board shall permit no person to vote who has solicited, directly or indirectly, by himself or through another person, or who has been promised by any candidate, directly or indirectly, payment or promise of payment, office, appointment, emolument or anything of value, for his vote, support or influence. Each voter shall indicate the person or persons for whom he votes by a cross mark placed in the box opposite the name of said person, and every vote or cross mark shall be counted which clearly expresses the intention of the voter. The said inspectors shall keep a full and complete list of all persons whose votes are accepted, and of all persons whose votes were rejected, and such lists must be returned with the ballots, with the reasons in writing for the rejection of all votes rejected, naming the persons, affidavits and returns of the election board. No voter shall be allowed more than ten minutes to mark his ballot. The polls shall be closed promptly at eight o'clock P.M., and the said board shall proceed to count the votes cast for the several candidates, and make out a correct return of all the votes cast for them, and the names of the offices for which each is a candidate; the votes cast for each opposite their respective names, the affidavits made by the board, the return of the election board, the list of accepted voters, and the list of rejected applicants to vote which shall be placed in the ballot box, which shall be locked and sealed with a paper strip pasted over the keyhole and extending over the lid of said box onto the side thereof, and the names of said board shall be written across said seal, together with the number of the district and precinct, before said seal is pasted on said box, and the said box shall not be reopened until a meeting of the county convention hereinafter provided for. The ballot boxes used at said primary election shall be provided by the Board of Election Supervisors of said county, and shall be delivered to said primary
