

To erect school house. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the School Commissioners of Washington County are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to appropriate the sum of nine hundred dollars for the purchase of a site and the erection of a school house for the white children in said county, to be located in Election District No. 11, within one-half mile of Weverton.

Supervision and control of same. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That said school house shall be erected under the supervision and control of the School Commissioners of said county, and the site or location for said school house shall be determined upon by said School Commissioners.

Funds to build. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That if the said School Commissioners of said Washington County shall not have sufficient funds in their hands to pay the said nine hundred dollars for building said school house, then and in that event the County Commissioners are duly authorized, required and directed to pay out of the funds of said county the said sum of nine hundred dollars for building said school house.

Authority given. SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That if the County Commissioners shall be required to pay the said nine hundred dollars, they are hereby directed and authorized to include the said nine hundred dollars in their next general levy made in the county.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 512.

AN ACT to change the name, extend the privileges and amend the charter of the Supreme Council of United Craftsmen of Dorchester County, a corporation duly incorporated under the General Laws of this State.

Supreme Council of United Craftsmen. WHEREAS, The Supreme Council of United Craftsmen of Dorchester County, a corporation duly incorporated under the General Laws of this State, relating to the creation and regulation of incorporated companies in the State of Maryland, is desirous of changing its corporate name to the "Supreme Council of United Craftsmen," by dropping the words "of Dorchester County," and is also desirous of extending its privileges and enlarging its powers, rights and franchises, and to make certain of the legality of the transaction and assurances it proposes to undertake; therefore,
