WHEREAS, William P. Dodson, of Norfolk, Virginia, erroneously paid to the several collectors of State and county taxes Not subject to of Talbot County for the years 1809 and 1902 the sum of thirty-five dollars and fifty-six cents as taxes upon a certain mortgage, which under the law was not subject to taxation, owing to the fact that said mortgage was a collateral mortgage, and the mortgagee received no revenue therefrom; and

WHEREAS, The County Commissioners of Talbot County have refunded to the said William P. Dodson the sum of twen-Sum unpaid. ty-six dollars and sixty-seven cents, being three-fourths of the said thirty-five dollars and fifty-six cents paid into the treasury of said county, leaving unpaid the sum of eight dollars and eighty-nine cents, which was erroneously paid into the State Treasury.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby To refund the authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer of Maryland to pay the said William P. Dodson, of Norfolk, Virginia, the said sum of eight dollars and eighty-nine cents collateral mortgage taxes erroneously paid by him into the Treasury of Maryland during the years above mentioned.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 520.

AN ACT to repeal Section 18 of Chapter 482 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, Session of 1900, amending the charter of the town of Brunswick, Frederick County. Maryland, and to re-enact said Section 18 of Chapter 482 of the Acts of 1000 with amendments so as to read as follows:

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 18 of Chapter 482 of the Acts of the Gen-Amending a eral Assembly of Maryland, Session of 1900, amending the charter of the town of Brunswick in Frederick County, Maryland, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as follows:

18. The Council shall have power to pass all ordinances Council to necessary (1) for the good government of the town; (2) to pass all ordiprevent, remove and abate, or cause to be removed or abated,
