and pay the sum of twenty dollars, and on failure to pay said fine and State costs, he or they shall be committed to the jail of Frederick County for the period of sixty days. If said fine is paid, the one-half shall be paid to the informer whether he be an officer or some other person, and the other half to the County Commissioners of Frederick County for the benefit of the public roads of said county.

Prosecution.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That said violation of this Act shall be prosecuted in the name of the State, and that the several justices of the peace of Frederick County shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine the same.

SEC 5. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 552.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 8 of Article 41 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, entitled "Governor."

Repeal of a section.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 8 of Article 41 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, entitled "Governor," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Remitting a recognizance.

8. The Governor may remit the whole or any part of any recognizance which may be forfeited; provided, the judge of the court in which such forfeiture took place shall recommend the remission of the whole or some part thereof; and provided further, that the Governor may remit the whole or any part of any recognizance taken by a justice of the peace and forfeited, upon recommendation of said justice of the peace, or upon such other recommendation or statements of the fact as the Governor may deem satisfactory.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
