lic street or avenue, and every such room in which such liquors are kept for sale shall after and during the hours such place is required to be closed and on Sundays and upon all days on which elections are held in said town of Laurel, have at east one window or door free from all screens, curtains, frosted or stained glass, so that a full, free view of the interior of said room may be had from the street.

Pertaining to offenders against the law.

- 18. That it shall be the duty of the resident constables and the bailiffs of the town of Laurel, or any other officer resident in the town, to visit all places where it is suspected that any beer, whiskey, ambrosia, wines or any other spirituous or fermented liquors are sold or kept for sale in violation of this Act, and arrest all violators, to be dealt with according to law; and constables shall report any violation of this Act to the grand jury, and the bailiffs of said town shall report to the Mayor and City Council of said town under oath. And said officers shall not visit any saloons licensed under this Act unless called for the purpose of quelling a disturbance or in the discharge of any duty imposed upon them by law; and any officer or officers who shall violate this section shall be dismissed, after a hearing and proof of a violation thereof, by the board or authorities who appointed them.
- Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 557.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 4, of Chapter 102 of the Acts of 1896, entitled "An Act to provide for the formation of farmers' institutes in the State of Maryland, and to appropriate a sum of money therefor," as amended by Chapter 363 of the Acts of 1900.

Formation of farmers' institutes.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 4 of Chapter 102 of the Acts of 1896, entitled "An Act to provide for the formation of farmers' institutes in the State of Maryland, and to appropriate a sum of money therefor," as amended by Chapter 363 of the Acts of 1900, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:
