Minor or
married
woman.

SEC. 8. *And be it enacted*, That whenever any deposits shall be made by a minor or married woman, such deposits shall be received or held and paid out on precisely the same terms and conditions as those of adult male or adult female depositors, and the check, receipt or acquittance of such minor or married woman shall be valid and binding on them, any law of this State to the contrary notwithstanding.

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 560.

AN ACT to add an additional section to be known as Section 177A and to come immediately after Section 177 of Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Prince George's County," and to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 178 of said Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*. That a new section to be known as Section 177A and to come immediately after Section 177 be and is hereby added to Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws, to read as follows:

177A. The Governor shall biennially appoint two capable and discreet persons, residents and taxpayers of Prince George's County, not practicing members of the bar, who shall be jury commissioners for Prince George's County. It shall be the duty of the jury commissioners at some time, not less than fifteen days before the commencement of each term of the Circuit Court at which jurors are required to attend, in the presence of such practicing members of the Bar as may choose to be present, to proceed to select from the lists last furnished by the clerk of the Board of County Commissioners, provided for in Article 51, Section 6 of the Code of Public General Laws, and from the poll books of the several election districts of the county that shall be returned and filed in the Clerk's office of the Circuit Court for Prince George's County, or wherever said poll books may by law be required to be filed, a panel to consist of two hundred persons to be fairly and impartially selected from those on said lists between the ages
