Council to issue such bonds at one time to the amount of five thousand dollars, but are hereby authorized and empowered to issue the different series from time to time as necessity may arise, and the total issue under the provisions of this Act shall in no case exceed the said sum of fifteen thousand dollars.

SEC. 7. And be it enacted, That the funds arising from the sale of said bonds shall be at the disposal of said Mayor and Funds: How City Council in their discretion for the payment of such expenses for the improvement, maintenance or repair of the streets, avenues, lanes, alleys, ways, gutters or sidewalks of said city, or for such other public improvements as to the said Mayor and City Council may seem proper.

SEC. 8. And be it enacted, That the said Mayor and City Council are hereby authorized and empowered to employ and of agents, etc. compensate such agents, officers, servants or employees as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act.

Sec. 9. And be it enacted, That all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act be and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. 10. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 562.

AN ACT to define and regulate the time for the taking and catching of oysters with scoops, scrapes and dredges in the waters of Dorchester and Talbot Counties, and to amend Section 250 of Article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws. title "Dorchester County," sub-title "Oysters," and Section 161 of Article 21 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Talbot County," sub-title "Oysters," as amended by Chapter 674 of the Acts of 1900.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to Pertaining to take or catch oysters with scoop, scrape or dredge in the waters of Dorchester and Talbot Counties, as now permitted by law, between the fifteenth day of March and the first day of November next, and for a violation of the same shall be
