

## LAWS OF MARYLAND.

Mill dams.

130. Wherever any mill dam may be built in said county upon any branch or stream where the public road crosses such branch or stream, the owner of any such mill shall, within one month from the building thereof, erect a causeway across the breast of such dam, at least twelve feet wide, and shall keep such dam and the bridge incident to the same in good repair so that the public road shall be in no way affected injuriously thereby; and such owner shall be exempt from any summons to work on the public roads.

Neglecting to repair same.

131. If any such dam or bridge shall get out of repair and the owner on notice from the road supervisor or County Commissioners shall neglect for the space of sixty days to repair the same, the County Commissioners shall proceed to make such repairs, and the owner shall be bound to pay them such outlay on account thereof, and the same may be collected as taxes, unless the mill shall be abandoned with its privileges, in which case the owner shall be released.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Relating to public education.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Sections 5, 7, 9, 10, 11, 16, 17, 17B, 17C, 18, 19, 21, 22, 24, 27, 39, 40, 42, 43, 47, 48, 49, 52, 53, 53A, 59, 61, 61B, 63, 66, 70, 71, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 83, 87, 94, 96, 98, 100, 103 and 104 of Article 77 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Public Education," be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, so as to read as follows:

Appointing State Board of Education.

5. The Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, if in session, and without said advice and consent when not in session, shall appoint before the first Monday in
