all persons qualified, as is specified in the second section CHAP. 145. of this set, shall be entitled to vote; in the event of the death, Vacancy resignation, removal or disqualification of the Burgess, the board of commissioners shall select one of their own body to serve as said Burgess until the next annual election.

Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners Clerk-his duties or a majority of them shall have power to appoint a clerk, and assign his duties, and allow him such compensation for his services as they may think proper; and that all ordinances passed by the said commissioners, and signed by the Burgess of said town, shall by their clerk be entered in a book to be by him kept for that purpose, and shall be open at all times for the inspection of any person interested, and copies of all ordinances shall be put up in the most public places, signed by the Burgess of said town, that the same may be generally made known, and attested by the

clerk to the said commissioners.

Sec. 7. And be it enacted, That the commissioners of Powers of commis-Middletown shall have full power and authority to enact and pass all by-laws and ordinances for the following purposes, viz: to grade, level, pave and repair all side walks in said town; to construct crossways, to regulate and keep in repair all streets, lanes and alleys in said town; to regulate party walls and partition fences; to regulate the sweeping and burning of chimnies; to restrain and prohibit gaming; to provide for licensing or restraining theatrical, or other public exhibitions and amusements within the limits of the corporation; to enact by-laws for the prevention and extinguishment of fire in said town; to license or prevent dogs from running at large in said town, in all cases; when the convenience of the town may require it, and for taxing them; to enforce the removal of nuisances, by fines or otherwise; to pass laws and ordinances to prevent the introduction of contagious diseases within the said town: to adopt all ordinances for the suppression of drunkenness, vice and immorality; to punish by fine for a breach of the peace; to punish corporally any servant or slave guilty of a violation of any ordinance, unless the master or mistress pay the fine annexed to the offence; and to lay and collect taxes for all purposes necessary to carry into effect, the ordinances and by-laws of the said town.

Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That the commissioners for the surveyor time being shall have power to appoint a surveyor to lay
