

CHAP. 244.

Public highway

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the road herein before mentioned shall forever hereafter be a public highway, and shall be kept in repair as other county roads are, and it shall be the duty of the commissioners of Baltimore county to appoint a supervisor on said road, and cause the same to be kept in repair as other county roads in said county.

Plat and record

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That it shall be the duty of the petitioners herein before mentioned, or any one of them to cause the said road to be surveyed as soon as convenient, and to make a map and certificate thereof, and to return the same to the commissioners of Baltimore county, to be recorded in the office thereof.

Passed Mar. 14, 1834 *An act for incorporating the Livingston Academy, in Baltimore county.*

Preamble

WHEREAS, application has been made to this general assembly of Maryland, for the passage of a law to incorporate the Livingston Academy, in Baltimore county;—
Therefore,

Persons incorporated

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That William Gibbs, Philemon Coal, Lewis Roberts, Edward Norwood, Amos Matthews, Dr. Josiah Marsh, William G. Wilkins, Nathaniel H. Ware, George W. McConkey, Edward Rider, be, and they are hereby appointed the first trustees of the said academy, and the said trustees and their successors to be elected in the manner hereinafter mentioned, shall be, and they are hereby declared to be one community, corporation and body politic, with perpetual succession in deed and in law, to all intents and purposes, connected with the said institution, by the name and style of the Livingston Academy, by which name and title, they and their successors shall be competent and capable in law and in equity, to take and to hold to themselves and their successors, for the use of the said academy, any estate in messuages, lands and tenements, annuities, goods, chattles, moneys or effects, by the gift, grant or bargain, sale, conveyance, devise or bequest, of any person or persons whatsoever; *Provided,* the same do not exceed in the whole, the clear yearly val-
