CHAPTER 260.

Passed Mar. 15, 1854 *An act to regulate the Terms of Prince George's county Court.*

Term fixed

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That from and after the April term of Prince George's county court next succeeding the passage of this act the terms of said court shall be commenced on the days hereinafter stipulated to wit: on the third Monday in November, and on the fourth Monday in April, in each and every year, instead of the second Monday in October, and the first Monday in April, as now provided by law.

Cases pending

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That nothing in this act contained shall operate as a discontinuance of any cause in said court pending after the next April term thereof, but all such cases shall be continued over until the next succeeding term created by this act.

Repeal

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted,* That all laws inconsistent with the provisions of this act be, and the same are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 261.

Passed Mar. 15, 1854 *A supplement to an act, entitled, an act, to reduce into one, the several acts of assembly, respecting elections, and to regulate such elections.*
