WHEREAS, the present mode of contracting for the stationary for the use of the Executive and Legislature is attended with great inconvenience and much delay-Therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Librarian be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to purchase annually hereafter the usual and necessary supplies of stationary for the use of the Executive and Legislative departments of this state, previously to the meeting of each session of the Legislature, and that the bills for stationary so purchased by him be annually submitted to the examination of the joint committee on the Library, and on the approval of said committee, the committee on claims shall pay or cause to be paid to the person or persons from whom said purchases shall have been made, such sums as may appear to be due in the same manner as similar claimants are now paid, and that the committee on claims allow the Librarian seventy-five dollars for his services.

Resolved, That resolution number eleven, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty, directing the Clerk of the Council to advertise that proposals will be received for furnishing stationary for the Executive and Legislature, be and the same is hereby repealed.
