30. An act to confirm an act, entitled, an act to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relates to the division of Washington county, into seven election districts and for other purposes, passed at December session, 1832, chap. 92.

31. An act entitled, an act to repeal an act to provide for the repairs of the public roads in Calvert county, passed at December session, 1832, chapt. 223.

42. A supplement to an act entitled an act to incorporate the Beaverdam and Harringtons Branch and Canal Company.

43. An act for the relief of John D. Ward, former Sheriff of Calvert county.

44. An act to make valid the official acts of Willson Hays as Justice of the Peace for Frederick County

45. A supplement to the act entitled an act to incorporate Prince Frederick Town Academy in Calvert county, passed at December session 1832, Chap. 246.
