by him for that purpose, and shall be opened at all times for the inspection of any person interested, and copies of all ordinances shape be put up in the most public places of said town, that the same may be generally made known.

Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That all fines and forfeitures rable under the ordinances of said corporation, shall be recoverable before the President aforesaid, as small debts are recoverable out of court, or before any justice of the peace.

Sec. 9. And be it enacted, That the limits of the said Town limits town of Franklin, shall extend to the distance of one quarter of a mile from Franklin House Hotel, aforesaid, each way, and the property within said limits shall be subject to such charges and taxes as may be deemed necessary by the said commissioners, or by a majority of them, to support and maintain the expenses which may at any time be

incurred in the improvement of said town.

Sec. 10. And be it enacted, That the said commission- sioners ers, or a majority of them, shall have full power to make all such by laws, regulations and ordinances, not inconsistent with the laws and constitution of this state, as from time to time they may deem wise, equitable and expedient, for the comfort, health, convenience and prosperity of said town, and its inhabitants, for the prevention or removal of nuisances, preservation of health, and suppression of vice and immorality, within the limits of said town, and shall have power to lay an equal tax on the property with. Tax in the said limits, to such amount as may from time to time be deemed necessary to accomplish the purposes aforesaid; which tax shall be collected and paid to the president and commissioners by the collector by them appointed, who collector shall have the same power to distrain therefor, as the collector of the public county assessment has to distrain for the same; and that the said president and commissioners shall fix the term of office, responsibility and compensation of such collector.

Sec. 11 And be it enacted, That the said commissioners, Ballet or a majority of them, shall have full power and authority annually to appoint a bailiff, whose duty it shall be to preserve the peace and good order of said town, and for this purpose, he is hereby invested with the same power and authority, as any constable may now have under the laws of this state.
