## CHAPTER 62.

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An act Supplementary to the acts, relating to the Universi-Passed Feb. 18,1834 ty of Maryland.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Reduction of number of trustees.

Maryland, That no vacancy which may happen in the board of trustees of the University of Maryland, shall be filled up, until the whole number (exclusive of the Governor) shall be reduced to twelve.

Report absences

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the Board of Trustees, to report to the Governor and Council the names of such Trustees as shall be absent from four successive sessions of the board, unless prevented by sickness, or absence from the state, on public duty, Appointments value of the places of such Trusteed

tees shall be deemed vacated.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That before the place of Notification required any Trustee shall be vacated, he shall have been notified to attend each of the four successive sessions, by personal notice or through the Post office, at least ten days before the commencement of each session; and provided also, that the provisions of the second section of this act, shall not be construed to apply to the Governor.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That a majority of the whole Quorum number of Trustees shall be a quorum, and that the assent of a majority of the whole actual number shall be necessary for the appointment or removal of a provost, professor, lecturer, tutor, or demonstrator, and for the estab-Regulation lishment, alteration or abolishment of a professorship or

lectureship in said University.
