CHAP. 63.

An act Supplementary to the acts, relating to the University of Maryland. Passed Feb. 18, 1834

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That no vacancy which may happen in the board of trustees of the University of Maryland, shall be filled up, until the whole number (exclusive of the Governor) shall be reduced to twelve. Reduction of number of trustees

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That it shall be the duty of the Board of Trustees, to report to the Governor and Council the names of such Trustees as shall be absent from four successive sessions of the board, unless prevented by sickness, or absence from the state, on public duty, and upon such report being made, the places of such Trustees shall be deemed vacated. Report absentees

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted,* That before the place of any Trustee shall be vacated, he shall have been notified to attend each of the four successive sessions, by personal notice or through the Post office, at least ten days before the commencement of each session; and provided also, that the provisions of the second section of this act, shall not be construed to apply to the Governor. Notification required

Sec. 4. *And be it enacted,* That a majority of the whole number of Trustees shall be a quorum, and that the assent of a majority of the whole actual number shall be necessary for the appointment or removal of a provost, professor, lecturer, tutor, or demonstrator, and for the establishment, alteration or abolishment of a professorship or lectureship in said University. CHAPTER 63.

An act for the benefit of George W. Cummins, and Jacob Raymond, administrators of John Cummins, deceased, of the state of Delaware. Passed Feb. 13, 1834

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That George W. Cummins, and Jacob Raymond, of the state of Delaware, by virtue of letters of administration granted to them in the state of Delaware, on Leave granted to remove a negro
