2000 Ayes and Nays, or as many as may be required, free of charge.

This proposition to embrace all the printing already done, as well as all that may be ordered hereafter by the Senate, and give bond in the sum of twenty thousand dollars, for the faithful execution of the work. The work to be approved by the Joint Committee on Printing, before being paid for.

For indexing the Journal of the Senate and the Documents, your Committee report, that they have contracted with James H. Hodges, Esq., for the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars, to do the same, the work to be completed within twenty days after the expiration of the session.
