On motion of Mr. Koons, (the rules being suspended,)

Leave was granted the Committee on Claims, (hereafter to be appointed,) to report a bill refunding a sum of money to Daniel Main, of Frederick county, erroneously paid by him into the Treasury.

Mr. Keech submitted the following order:
