Mr. Nicodemus presented the petition of D. P. Jacobs and 100 others, citizens of Frederick county, for an alteration or amendment of the present Fence Law, such as will require all land-owners to keep sufficient outside fences as to turn all kinds of stock, or pass such laws as to prohibit any damage arising from stock breaking through bad fences.
