Whereupon the Speaker declared that Hon. Barnes Compton, having received a majority of all the votes cast, was duly elected Treasurer of the State of Maryland, for the term prescribed by the Constitution.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following message:

BY THE SENATE,

January 20th, 1874.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We have had under careful consideration your Joint Resolution in regard to procuring an address to be delivered in the Hall of the House of Delegates on the 17th March, on the life and public services of the late Chief Justice Taney, and respectfully decline to concur therein. We invite your favorable consideration of the Joint Resolution of the Senate, introduced simultaneously with your own, as being more in consonance with the facts of the case; the Committee appointed to procure a statue of the late Chief Justice Taney, having executed the duty confided to them, when they submitted their request on the 10th day of December, 1872, and delivered the statue into the possession and keeping of the State
